When a disaster happens:

- Disasters happen without warning and can cause disruptions to the phone system and damage or congestion to transportation routes.
- It will take time for the city, county and state to get a clear picture of the impacts of the disaster. During this time, stay off all phones for a minimum of 3-5 hours following a disaster, unless you are calling 911 for a life-threatening situation.
- Stay where you are and take care of yourself and those around you, unless you have been given directions to move to a safer area.
- Listen to AM/FM radio to find out which roadways are available and those to avoid.

Learning some basic skills can help reduce injuries and damage to property and prepare you to take care of yourself and others.

A Hub is a communication point where citizens can send and receive messages during a time of disaster, when normal communications to city services are disabled.

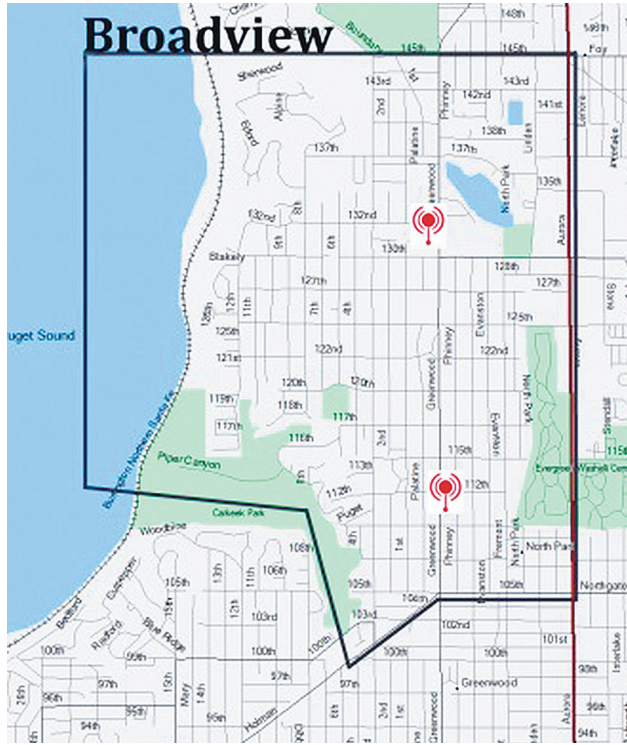
Who operates a Hub?

Please Note: During an emergency situation, the Hub site may need to be relocated to ensure the safety of the volunteers and community members.

A Hub provides communication services and helps to match up local needs and resources but does not offer water, food, shelter or first aid.

Ways to Prepare Your Family for a Disaster

Have enough water for 3-7 days



Store enough food for 3-7 days

- Consider special diets and pets

Prepare a disaster kit that includes:

- A complete first aid kit along with necessary medications
- A flashlight with extra batteries
- Warm and waterproof clothing
- Tools you believe would be helpful (hammer, axe, saw)

Prepare a family disaster plan

- Designate a meeting place for when you are out of the house
- Plan and practice an evacuation route for your home
- Teach your younger children how to call for help

Organize with neighbors

- Meet with neighbors to find out what resources may be available and who may need extra help
